This joint London-Singapore seminar organised by LSLC and SCMA would be a discussion on sanctions and shipping with esteemed speakers Roderick Cordara KC from Essex Court Chambers, Ian Teo from Helmsman LLC, Francis Hornyold-Strickland from 36 Stone and Karnan Thirupathy from Kennedys Law LLP, and with Maureen Poh from Helmsman LLC as the moderator.

Split into three parts, the speakers will address several current issues in maritime law including:

- (1) The evolving sanctions regime against the Russian Federation, including issues pertinent to shipping and insurance law, as at November 2022;
- (2) Current issues and concerns regarding charter party *force majeure* and exception clauses, in relation to the blockage (and unblockage) of ports in Ukraine; and
- (3) The case of MUR Shipping BV v RTI Ltd [2022] EWCA Civ 1406 concerns a contract of affreightment that required payment in US Dollars. This obligation was made impossible due to sanctions against the Russian Federation. The issue on appeal before the UK Court of Appeal was whether freight payment could be discharged in a non-contractual currency, EUR, pursuant to an express or implied term to use reasonable endeavours to overcome a force majeure event. Alternatively, whether an obligation to use reasonable endeavours extends to varying the provisions on the agreed currency.
